Anthony Michael Villa – Tony (1931 – 2024)

Tony was born in Mudgee on November 14, 1931. He lived in Mudgee his whole childhood, attending St Matthews convent School for the entirety of his education.

He was employed as a Telegram Boy at the Sydney GPO, which was the start of a career spanning 50 years with Australia Post.

In the mid 1950's Tony also did a stint in the Royal Australian Navy Reserve.

He married Beverley Burge in 1958 and they had 4 children: Michael, Timmy, Therese and Patti. They were married 27 years until Beverley passed in 1985.

A few years later, Tony met Pam, and they were married in 1990. Tony became stepfather to Michael and Jay-Ann.

Tony was Pop and Poppy to his many grandchildren and great grandchildren.

During his time in Dapto, Tony dedicated most of his energies to St Vincent de Paul, the Illawarra Rugby League, St John's Church and Parish.

Tony was one of the founding members of Dapto St Vincent de Paul. He later went on to become the President of the local St Vincent de Paul Society and worked tirelessly to support others. In 2013, Pope Francis bestowed an Apostolic Blessing on him for his then **50 year** involvement with the St Vincent de Paul Society.

Tony was also a fundamental part of the Illawarra Rugby League as both a referee and an administrator and was a member of the Steering Committee that put forward the case to have an Illawarra team included in the Sydney Competition. It was a highlight for Tony, when the Illawarra Steelers were admitted to the Sydney League in 1980. After 11 years on the Steelers Board of Directors, Tony was given the honour of being elected as The Steelers inaugural Life Member in 1991.

After Tony retired he was not one to sit still and he was always out, involved somewhere in the community. He was a volunteer driver during the Sydney Olympics in 2000.

All his years of community service were recognised in 2016, with an Order of Australia medal.

Tony has left a legacy of kindness and commitment. He loved and inspired many and will be sadly missed.
